## Chains

Raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, E. of cor.

From the above point the cor. originally established for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 12, bears North 0.65 chs. dist., mkd. by an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., conforming to the record. The cor. now serves for sec. 12 only. I remark the monument to read.

## General Description

The general elevation of the township ranges from approximately 2,420 feet above sea level in the southwestern portion to 2,500 feet in the northwestern portion, and 3,000 feet in the east central portion of the township. The eastern two-thirds of the township ranges from rough, mountainous land in the north center, east central and south central portions, to gently rolling land, and the western one-third is nearly level desert land.

The soil is a sandy and gravelly loam and the drainage is generally south. The township is covered with a medium, even growth of creosote bush, some sagebrush and shadscale. There are no flowing springs or streams in the township.

An asphalt paved road, U. S. Highway No. 95, enters the township from the east approximately 12 chains north of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner of sections 25 and 30, traverses in a general WNW direction and leaves the township near the S.  $\frac{1}{16}$  section corner of section 18 on the west boundary. An asphalt paved road, State Highway No. 29, enters the township from the south about midpoint between the corner of sections 19, 24, 25 and 30 and the W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  section corner of section 19, traverses in a general NNE. direction through section 19 and makes a junction with U. S. Highway No. 95 at Lathrop Wells, Nevada which is located in the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 18.

There are several settlers located at Lathrop Wells, Nevada and buildings consisting of two service station, one motel, two cafes, a trailer court and three small houses with outbuildings. There are no other settlers in the township and none of the land is under cultivation.
