

Dependent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 39 N., R. 33 E.

Chains

Over nearly level desert land.

40.40 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains NE.

40.71 Point for the cor. of Tps. 39 and 40 N., R. 33 E., at proportionate dist. latitudinally and at record dist. longitudinally from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36; there is no remaining evidence of the original cor.Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

From this cor. the E. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 25, T. 40 N., R. 33 E., monumented by a cedar stake, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., not mkd., bears N. $2^{\circ} 18'$ E., 122.23 chs. dist.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, in a collar of stone, with brass cap mkd.

Over nearly level desert land.

39.98 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, monumented by the remains of a cedar stake, not mkd.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
