Chains

At the SC of secs. 32 and 33, on S. bdy. T. 11 N., R. 40 E., marked by a granite stone, 19x17x12 ins., firmly set in ground, mkd. with 2 notches on W. and 4 notches on E. edge, and a cross on top (destroyed) witnessed by a mound of stone, 2x1½ ft., W. of cor.

At cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to rock, over glass deposit, with orig. cor. stone buried on W. side of post; brass cap marked

Remonumentation of Corners T. 8 N., R. 42 E., M.D. Mer.

The east boundary was surveyed by Tracy in 1867. The south, west and north boundaries and a portion of the subdivisinal lines of T. 8 N., R. 42 E., Mount Diablo Meridian were surveyed by Hatch, Barker and Bridge in 1873.

The following field notes are those of the remonumentation of certain identified original corners in T. 8 N., R. 42 E., M.D. Mer., Nevada. The position of each corner was marked by the original monument, or determined from corner accessories recorded in the original survey record.

The corners remonumented were selected by the Forest Service as being adjacent to, or controlling the boundaries of Forest Service Lands. The remonumentation was requested by and accomplished in cooperation with the Forest Service.

T. 8 N., R. 42 E., M.D. Mer.

At the cor. of secs. 9, 10, 15, and 16, T. 8 N., R. 42 E., which is marked with a cedar stake, 2 ins. diam., squared at the top, 3 ft. long, no marks remaining, found lying at base of small mound of stone. This cor. was reported found by R. D. Garver, Forest Service Surveyor in 1913, and has been accepted by the adjacent rancher for a long period of time.

At cor. point, center of mound.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, with orig. cor. stake set alongside; brass cap marked
