Homestead Entry Survey No. 83, located in unsurveyed sections 31 and 32, T. 9 N., R. 42 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada, was surveyed by W. B. Rice, Forest Assistant in 1914.

The following field notes are those of the remonumentation of identified original corners on Homestead Entry Survey No. 83, located in unsurveyed sec. 32, T. 9 N., R. 42 E., M.D. Mer., Nevada.

The corners remonumented were selected by the Forest Service as being adjacent to, or controlling the boundaries of Forest Service Lands. The remonumentation was requested by, and accomplished in cooperation with the Forest Service.
