

Remonumentation of Corners, HES No. 140, in
T. 8 N., R. 41 E. (Unsurveyed)

Chains

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., .18 ins. in the ground, to rock, over broken glass, and supported in a large mound of stone; brass cap marked

Corner is located on a steep, rocky SW. slope, about 1 ch. NE. of head of small stream in Cottonwood Canyon, drains S.

Corner No. 4 HES No. 140 is not remonumented.

Remonumentation of Corners, HES No. 141 in
T. 10 N., R. 40 E. (Unsurveyed)

Homestead Entry Survey No. 141, located in unsurveyed sec. 20, T. 10 N. R. 40 E., Mount Diablo Meridian, Nevada, was surveyed by F. C. Haman in 1917.

The following field notes are those of the remonumentation of identified original corners on Homestead Entry Survey No. 141, situated in unsurveyed T. 10 N., R. 40 E., M.D. Mer., Nevada. The corners remonumented were selected by the Forest Service as being adjacent to, or controlling the boundaries of Forest Service Lands. The remonumentation was requested by, and accomplished in cooperation with the Forest Service.

HES No. 141, in T. 10 N., R. 40 E. (Unsurveyed)

At. cor. No. 1, HES No. 141, marked with a cross on top of stationary granite boulder, showing 4x3x2 ft. above ground, mkd. 1 HES 141; witnessed by a mound of stone within claim, and 2 bearing rocks as described in official record.

At. cor. point

Set a brass tablet, $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., $3\frac{1}{2}$ in. stem, cemented in drill hole; tablet marked

Corner located at base N. slope, and about 30 lks. N., and 50 lks. E. of cor. fences, around claim.

From this cor. the recorded tie to USLM # 273 is S. $34^{\circ} 52'$ W., 11.37 chs. dist.
