

Remonumentation of Corners, T. 16 N., R. 44 E.

Chains

scribed $\frac{1}{2}$ S BT.

Raise a small mound of stone around post.

Corner is located on gentle NE. slope, about 25 lks. S. of small ravine, drains E.

At the cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, on W. bdy. of T. 16 N., R. 44 E., which is marked with a granite stone, 18x7x6 ins., marked with 2 notches on S. and 4 notches on N. edge; firmly set in the ground, and witnessed by a small mound of stone on the W. No evidence found of the 2 original bearing trees recorded in NW and SW. quadrants.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, and original cor. stone buried on S. edge of post; brass cap mkd.

Place collar of rock around post, and rebuild mound of stone to the W.

At the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29, and 30, T. 16 N., R. 44 E., which is marked with a slate stone, 23x10x6 ins., marked with 2 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edge; firmly set in a small mound of stone; unwitnessed.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over broken glass; buried original cor. stone on S. edge of post; brass cap mkd.

The east boundary, portions of the south and north boundaries and subdivisional lines of T. 17 N., R. 44 E., M.D. Mer. were surveyed by Hatch, Barker and Bridges in 1873. Thurtell and Kearney completed the survey of the boundaries and subdivisional lines in 1909 and resurveyed a portion of the north boundary and subdivisional lines.

The following field notes are those of the remonumentation of certain identified original corners in T. 17 N., R. 44 E., Mt. Diablo Meridian, Nevada. The position of each corner was marked by the original monument, or determined from corner accessories recorded in the original survey record.

The corners remonumented were selected by the U. S. Forest Service as being adjacent to, or controlling the boundaries of Forest Service Lands. The remonumentation was requested by and accomplished in cooperation with the Forest Service.
