

Remonumentation of Corners, T. 19 N., R. 44 E., M.D. Mer.

Chains

At the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30; T. 19 N., R. 44 E., which is a granite stone, 18x9x7 ins., marked with 2 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edge; 44E on SW., and 19 N. on NE. face; firmly set, and witnessed by a circle of rock around cor.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, over broken glass, with original cor. stone buried on N. side of post; brass cap mkd.

Raise a large mound of stone to top, around post.

The town of Austin bears approximately NW ½ mile distant.

At the cor. of secs. 19 and 30, on W. bdy. of T. 19 N., R. 44 E., which is a granite stone, 18x12x8 ins., marked with 2 notches on S. and 4 notches on N. edge; unwitnessed.

At the cor. point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 20 ins. in ground to rock, over broken glass, with original cor. stone buried on W. side of post; brass cap mkd.

A juniper, 3 ins. diam., bears N. 47° E., 39 lks. dist., mkd. BT.

A pinon, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 55° E., 26 lks. dist. mkd. S30 BT.

Raise a mound of stone to top, around post.

Remonumentation of Corners, T. 19 N., R. 45 E., M.D. Mer.

The S. bdy. of T. 19 N., R. 45 E., was surveyed by D. H. Barker in 1874, and resurveyed by Thurtell and Kearney in 1909. The W. and portions of the east and north boundaries and subdivisional lines of the Tp. were surveyed by Barker and Skinner in 1875.

The following field notes are those of the remonumentation of certain identified original corners in T. 19 S., R. 45 E., Mt. Diablo Mer., Nevada. The position of each corner was marked by the original monument, or determined from corner accessories recorded in the original survey record.

The corners remonumented were selected by the U. S. Forest Service as being adjacent to, or controlling the boundaries of Forest Service Lands. The remonumentation was requested by and accomplished in cooperation with the Forest Service.
