General Description

Township 8 South, Range 44 East is located in a large valley, the general elevation is about 4,000 ft. above sea level. The soil is a mixture of sandy loam and clay, the northeastern portion being somewhat stony.

Nevada State Highway No. 72 enters the township on the west boundary near the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, traversing through sec. 6, leaving the township near the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, on the north boundary. U. S. Highway No. 95 enters the township on the north boundary near the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34, traversing through secs. 3, 2, 11, 12 and 13, leaving the township on the east boundary of sec. 24; midpoint between the corners of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24, and the ½ sec. cor. of secs. 19 and 24. A telephone line parallels the Highway through the township.

There are three settlers in sections 8, 10 and 11 who have small fields in cultivation, under irrigation. The water for irrigation is obtained from wells located on the homesteads.

There is no timber in the township. The vegetation consists cheifly of sage and native bunch grasses of medium growth along the washes, in other areas of the township the vegetation is scattered.
