

## CHAINS

Bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of corner.

Land, rolling.  
Soil, sandy clay.  
Undergrowth, sagebrush and shadscale.

N. 0° 12' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6.

Over mountainous land, through scattered undergrowth; asc. 440 ft. over steep S. slope.

17.80 Ridge, bears NE and SE, desc. 220 ft. over steep N slope.

34.90 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains S. 60° E., 10 chs. thence E., asc. 90 ft. over SW slope.

41.43 Point for the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 10 ins. in the ground to bedrock and in a mound of stone to cap, 6 t. base, to top of cap, with brass cap mkd.

50.30 Top of ascent, continue over rolling mountainous land.

73.60 Ravine, drains W., 8.00 chs., thence S.; asc. 60 ft. along rolling W. slope.

79.70 Ridge, bears E. and W., desc. 20 ft. over S. slope.

83.61 The cor. of Tps. 41 and 42 N., Rs. 27 and 28 E., monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

Land, mountainous.  
Soil, sandy clay and rocky.  
Undergrowth, sagebrush.
