

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF EAST BOUNDARY OF T.13 N., R.18 E.

Chains

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed by  
James S. Lawson, Deputy Surveyor, in 1861.

From the cor. of Ts.12 and 13 N., Rs.18 and 19 E.

N.0°08'E., bet. secs. 31 and 36. (S½ mile)

Descend 40 ft. on NE. slope of mountainous land, thru  
heavy timber and medium dense low undergrowth.

11.40 Draw, course E. about ¼ mile to an open meadow of about  
40 acres. The E. end of the meadow is dammed, making a  
shallow reservoir of water.

Ascend 240 ft. on broken SE. slope.

30.50 Divide between Lake Tahoe and Carson Valley, bears N.70°E.  
and S.70°W., slopes NE.; descend 300 ft. on broken N.slope.

35.50 Head of ravine, course N.20°E.; descend 50 ft. on broken  
NE. slope.

39.76 The ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, which is evidenced by  
the stub of a decayed pine post buried in center of origi-  
nal embedded mound of earth and stones, from which the  
original bearing trees:

A white bark pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S.35°E., 63  
lks. dist., showing 1/4 S BT on open old blaze.

A white bark pine, 14 ins. diam., bears N.51½°W., 111  
lks. dist., showing 1/4 S BT on open old blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the  
ground, with brass cap mkd.

Rebuild the mound of stone, 4 ft. base, around  
post to top.

N.0°11'E., bet. secs. 31 and 36. (N½ mile)

4.20 Head of ravine, course N.30°E.; descend 570 ft. on broken  
NE. slope.

18.90 An original line tree: a white fir, 36 ins. diam., mkd.  
with two hacks each on N. and S. sides.

39.97 The cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, in center of a dilapi-  
dated mound of stones, from which the original bearing  
trees:

A balsam fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.87¼°E., 76 lks.  
dist., scribe marks partially overgrown; not legible.

A balsam fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.62°E., 160 lks.  
dist., mkd. T13N R19E S31 BT.

A balsam fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.36°W., 154 lks.  
dist., scribe marks partially overgrown; not legible.

A yellow pine, 20 ins. diam., bears N.69½°W., 22 lks.  
dist., scribe marks partially overgrown; not legible.
