

DEPENDENT RESURVEY, N. Bdy. T. 13 N., R. 18 E.

	N. 89° 58' W., bet. secs. 3 and 34. (Fractional $W\frac{1}{2}$ mile.)
1.20	Center of paved highway, U.S. No. 50, bears N. 12° W. to Carson City, Nevada and S. 12° E. to Placerville, Calif.
2.00	Old road, unused, bears N. 10° W. and S.; desc. 100 ft. over broken W. slope.
9.10	Power transmission line, bears N. and S.
17.27	Intersect mean high water line of Lake Tahoe at the old meander cor. of fractional secs. 3 and 34 which is recovered in the center of an old mound of stones containing the charred remains of a surfaced pine post, 3 ins. diam., 10 ins. long, with indistinct scribe marks on one face.
	from which the remains of the original bearing tree:
	A pine stump, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 85½° E., 126 lks. dist., with a portion of the original scribe marks plainly visible.
	At the corner point
	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground in a mass of concrete, with the old corner stake deposited at the base, for meander cor. of fractional secs. 3 and 34, with brass cap mkd.

	Land, rough, broken mountainous.
	Soil, coarse gravelly to rocky loam, 3rd and 4th rate.
	Undergrowth, laurel, willows, alders, manzanita, bitter brush.
	Timber, yellow pine, balsam fir, red fir, cedar.
	Grazing, poor.

Reestablishment of the surveys executed by Butler Ives, Deputy Surveyor, in 1861.	
	From the cor. of secs. 35 and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.
	N. 0° 03' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36. ($S\frac{1}{2}$ mile)
	Over rough mountainous land through medium heavy large timber and scattering low undergrowth. Descend precipitous N. and NW. slopes 340 ft.
