82 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S35 BT.

A yellow pine, 18 ins. diam., bears N. $42\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.,
83 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S26 BT.

N. $89^{\circ} 52'$ W., bet. secs. 26 and 35. ($W\frac{1}{2}$ mile.)

Continue along a broken N. slope.

- 8.00 Slope changes to abrupt NW.; descend 190 ft.
28.20 Draw, drains N.; ascend 60 ft. over E. slope.
32.00 Spur, slopes N.; descend 80 ft. over W. slope.
34.82 Intersect the California-Nevada State Boundary Line.
Point for closing cor. of secs. 26 and 35.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in
soft granite ledge rock, with brass cap mkd.
