

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SECOND STD. PARALLEL NORTH THRU R. 22 E.

## Chains

A pinon pine, 11 $\frac{1}{4}$  ins. diam., bears S. 4 $^{\circ}$  W., 8 $\frac{1}{4}$  lks. dist., distinctly scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.  
 A pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 34 $^{\circ}$  W., 51 lks. dist., distinctly scribed  $\frac{1}{4}$ S BT.

## New bearing trees:

A pinon pine, 11 $\frac{1}{4}$  ins. diam., bears N. 9 $^{\circ}$  E., 65 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S36 SC BT.  
 A pinon pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 43 3/4 $^{\circ}$  W., 90 lks. dist., mkd.  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 36 SC BT.

## Thence

N. 89 $^{\circ}$  54' E., along the S. bdy. of Sec. 36, (East half mile.)

Desc. 60 ft. over SE. slope.

2.00 Drain, course S., desc. 340 ft. over broken SE. and S. slopes.

17.00 Draw, drains SE.

27.38 Intersect the original closing cor. of T. 10 N., Rs. 22 and 23 E., hereinafter described.

40.07 Intersect the original std. cor. of T. 11 N., Rs. 22 and 23 E., which is marked by a large embedded mound of earth and stones containing charred stub of a surfaced pine post.

At point for cor., in center of mound,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a large supporting mound of stone, for std. cor. of T. 11 N., Rs. 22 and 23 E., with brass cap mkd.

A pinon pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 43 $\frac{1}{4}$  $^{\circ}$  E., 186 lks. dist., mkd. T11N R23E S31 SC BT.

A pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 34 $\frac{1}{2}$  $^{\circ}$  E., 175 lks. dist., mkd. SC BT.

A pinon pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 76 $\frac{1}{4}$  $^{\circ}$  W., 126 lks. dist., mkd. SC BT.

A pinon pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 40 $^{\circ}$  W., 175 lks. dist., mkd. T11N R22E S36 SC BT.

This corner is situated along the west edge of an old mine road bearing S. 30 $^{\circ}$  E. to main highway and N. 20 $^{\circ}$  W., 1 chain to junction of road from the east.

Land, rough mountainous.

Soil, very shallow coarse rocky loam, 3d rate.

Timber, pinon pine, juniper.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush.

Grazing, fair.
