Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

A pinon pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S. $18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 67 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6 BT.
A pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears South 385 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S1 BT.

Asc. 500 ft. over very rocky SW. to W. slopes thru medium heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Intersect the Second Std. Par. N. at proportionate point for the closing cor. of secs. 1 and 6.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a large supporting mound of stone, for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 6, with brass cap mkd.

A pinon pine, 8 ins. diam., bears S. $59\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 159 lks. dist., mkd. T10N R22E S6 CC BT.
A pinon pine, 5 ins. diam., bears S. $41\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ W., 17 lks. dist., mkd. T10N R21E S1 CC BT.

From point of intersection, the Std. cor. of T. 11 N., Rs. 21 and 22 E.; a 3 in. iron post, firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the resurvey of T. 10 N., R. 21 E., executed under this same group, bears S. $89^{\circ} 55'$ E., 10.75 chs. dist.

From the same point the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 36, T. 11 N., R. 21 E., a 1 in. iron post, firmly set, mkd. and wit. as described in the field notes of the above resurvey, bears N. $89^{\circ} 55'$ W., 28.70 chs. dist.

Land, S. $\frac{1}{4}$ mile; rolling; balance of mile, rough mountainous. Soil, coarse gravelly loam to rocky; 2nd to 4th rate. Undergrowth, sagebrush, buck brush, rabbit brush, choke cherry. Timber, pinon pine, juniper, yellow pine, mahogany.
