Near the completion of the work and as a final test for the bearings of boundaries and subdivisional lines, on July 17, 1941, at the closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4 on the N. bdy. of the Tp., at 6hr 00.5m p.m., l.m.t., I make an observation on Polaris at western elongation; two each with the telescope in direct and reversed positions and reading the mean horizontal angle from a flag on line approximately 30 chs. westerly, in the direction W-N. to Polaris.

 Mean horizontal angle from flag to Polaris, W to N. 88° 41' 30"


DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE WEST BOUNDARY OF T. 9 N., R. 24 E.,

Reestablishment of the surveys executed by Deputy Surveyors Chase and Lash in 1868 under Contract No. 8 dated Oct. 9, 1867.

Beginning at the original cor. of Ts. 8 and 9 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E., which is a rotted pine post, 3 ins. diam., with two surfaced sides containing faint scribe marks and lying on a small embedded mound of stones. The three original bearing trees are in substantial agreement with the record; the blazed surfaces are partially overgrown but portions of the scribe marks are plainly visible.

At point for cor.,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground to solid rock, with the original corner post deposited at the base, for cor. of Ts. 8 and 9 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E., with brass cap mkd.

New bearing trees:

Pinon pine, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 72½° E., 85 lks. dist., mkd. T9N R24E S31 BT.

Pinon pine, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 13-3/4° E., 116 lks. dist., mkd. T8N R24E S6 BT.

Pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 29-3/4° W., 102 lks. dist., mkd. T8N R23E S1 BT.

Pinon pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 65° W., 36 lks. dist., mkd. T9N R23E S36 BT.

U.S.C.&G. station "Desert Creek Peak" bears N. 47° 15½' E., to center of a large cairn on highest point.

N. 0° 04' E., on true line along the W. bdy. of Sec. 31, T. 9 N., R. 24 E. (south half mile.)

Over broken mountainous land through medium heavy timber and dense undergrowth; desc. 60 ft. over gentle N. slope.

5.40 Shallow draw, drains N. 80° E.; asc. 65 ft. over SE. slope.

13.20 Spur, slopes E. from SW.; desc. along broken NW. slope.
