Dependent Resurvey of the N. Bdy. of T. 7 N., R. 45 E.

Chains

 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6

Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.

42.50 Wash, course S. 30° E.; asc. 20 ft.50.50 Wash, course S. 60° E.; asc. gradually 90 ft.
Enter scattering timber, bears N. and S.

67.50 Base of gradual slope; asc. abruptly 95 ft. over E. slope.

76.62 The cor. of Ts. 7 and 8 N., Rs. 44 and 45 E., marked by the original monument, a granite stone, $14 \times 12 \times 9$ ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. with 6 grooves on N., S., E. and W. faces.

This cor. is now altered and refers and stands for the cor. of Ts. 7 N., Rs. 44 and 45 E., and the SW. cor. of T. 8 N., R. $44\frac{1}{2}$ E., and the SE. cor. of T. 8 N., R. 44 E.

At the corner point.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Bury the original corner stone alongside the iron post.

Raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, 3 ft. high, S. of corner.

Land, rolling mountainous.

Soil, sandy, gravelly and rocky; 3rd rate.

Timber scattering scrub juniper along the W. $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Undergrowth, sagebrush; grazing, fair.

West Boundary of T. 8 N., R. 45 E.

Memorandum:

The W. bdy. of T. 8 N., R. 45 E., was surveyed on a cardinal line, North, from the cor. of Ts. 8 N., Rs. 45 and $44\frac{1}{2}$ E., heretofore described. On this bdy. the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, was established at the determined point of intersection with the sectional correction line, which governs the completion of the subdivisions of T. 8 N. R. 45 E. The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36 on the W. bdy. was established at a distance of 40 chains South, from the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36. Corners at regular distances of 40 and 80 chains were established on the W. bdy., North from the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31, and 36, to the intersection of the N. bdy. of the Tp.

Beginning at the cor. of Ts. 8 N., Rs. $44\frac{1}{2}$ and 45 E.
