

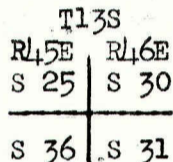
DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL MONUMENT

Chains

mile post is an iron post, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record; resurveyed under Group 227, California in 1931.

Land, mountainous.
 Soil, shallow coarse rocky, 3rd and 4th rate.
 No timber.
 Undergrowth, shadscale.
 Grazing, poor.

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF A PORTION OF THE WEST BDY. OF T. 13 S., R. 46 E.
 Reestablishing survey executed by M.D. Heist, Deputy Surveyor, in 1906.
 The original cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, T. 13 S., Rs. 45 and 46 E. is a granite rock, 18x12x12 ins., mkd. 5 notches on N. edge, and 1 notch on S. edge, firmly set in the ground and surrounded by a large flat mound of stone. At the corner point,
 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with the original rock deposited at the base, with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound of
 stone, 3 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

From the above cor.,

S. 0° 10' W., on true line bet. secs. 31 and 36, (north half mile.)
 Over rolling desert land thru scattering undergrowth.

.40 Wash, 15 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course NE.

15.00 Gully, course W.

31.30 Gully, course NW.

36.90 Low spur, slopes W.

39.93 Intersect the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which is a basalt rock, 14x10x3 ins., mkd: $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face, firmly set in a mound of stone. At point for cor.,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with the original corner rock deposited at the base, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound
 of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Thence

S. 0° 02' E., bet. secs. 31 and 36, (south half mile.)

Continue over rolling land.

2.40 Low ridge, bears NE. and SW.

14.40 Draw, drains SE.
