

## Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the East Bdy., T. 17 N., R. 64 E.

Chains

38.30 Ravine, drains E.

39.54 The original cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25 and 30, marked by a limestone, 10x12x18 ins., loosely set in old scattered mound of stone.

At the corner point

Reset the old stone, 10 ins. in the ground, and raise a flat mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., around the old stone.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, mostly gravelly and rocky, some sandy clay loam.

Timber, small scattering mahogany and aspen.

Undergrowth, sagebrush, service brush, snow brush, laurel and willows.

## Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the North Bdy., T. 16 N., R. 65 E.

Reestablishment of the Survey Executed By  
Monroe and Bateman, Deputy Surveyors, in 1874.

Note: This line was originally surveyed as a common boundary for both adjoining townships, but due to excessive distortion in the W. bdy. of sec. 31, T. 17 N., R. 65 E., the corners herein established at record distances will not serve for cors. of T. 17 N., R. 65 E., but are marked for sections of T. 16 N., R. 65 E. only.

From the reestablished cor. of Ts. 16 and 17 N., Rs. 64 and 65 E.

East, on the N. bdy. of sec. 6, T. 16 N., R. 65 E.

Over rolling mountainous land, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth; desc. 55 ft. over SE. slope to creek.

1.80 Graded road, bears N. 15° E. and S. 15° W.

3.10 Sagehen Creek, dry bed, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, drains N. 10° E.; asc. 240 ft. over W. slope.

16.10 Spur, slopes N. 10° E.; desc. 70 ft. over E. slope.

21.00 Ravine, drains N. 15° E.; asc. 90 ft. over W. slope.

28.77 Point for the ~~independent resurvey~~ S.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 31, T. 17 N., R. 65 E., hereinafter described.

29.40 Spur, slopes N. 15° E.; desc. 145 ft. over E. slope.

38.60 Ravine, course N.; asc. 5 ft.

39.40 Point for the N.  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of sec. 6, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
