	Raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.
41.80	Spur, 30 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., slopes N. 15° E.; desc. 180 ft. over E. slope.
52.50	Davis Creek, with trickle of water, 1 lk. wide, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. deep, course N.
55.60	Duck Creek, with trickle of water, 1 lk. wide, $\frac{3}{4}$ in. deep, course N. 15° W.; asc. 140 ft. over W. slope to spur.
56.40	Old road, bears S. for about 4.00 chs., then W. across above creeks, then again turns S.; and N. to junction with improved gravel road, about 8.00 chs. N. of line.
57.10	Improved gravel surfaced road, bears N. 15° W. and S. 15° E.
65.80	Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 20 ft. over gradual NE. slope.
68.77	Point for the cor. of secs. 31 and 32, T. 17 N., R. 65 E., hereinafter described.
75.20	Ravine, course N. 55° W.; asc. 85 ft. over SW. slope.
79.40	Point for the cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at record distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
	Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
