

## DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF PORTION OF SUBDIVISIONAL LINES, T. 4 S., R. 36 E.

Chains

From this point:

The former  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. of secs. 7 and 8, bears S.  $3^{\circ} 48' W.$ ,  
36.08 chs. dist.

Point for the former closing cor. of secs. 5 and 8, at proportion-  
ate distance on the Von Schmidt State Line bears S.  $85^{\circ} 30' E.$ ,  
2.80 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the portion  
of the Von Schmidt State Line retraced under this assignment.

Point for the former closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, at proportion-  
ate distance on the Von Schmidt State Line bears N.  $2^{\circ} 23' W.$ ,  
2.40 chs. dist.; described in the field notes of the portion  
of the Von Schmidt State Line retraced under this assignment.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land in the resurveyed portion of this township lies in  
the bottom and on the gentle NE. slopes on the SW. side of  
Fish Lake Valley Wash. The elevation is from 5000 to 5200 ft.  
above sea level.

The soil is generally sandy, gravelly, alkaline clayloam or  
coarse loam, with occasional fields of granite boulders which  
have been washed down from the rough mountainous lands to the  
west. Some of the land is washed but the few most prominent  
washes, all coursing NE., give no evidence of past raging  
torrents.

The undergrowth is very light and consists principally of  
sagebrush. There are also other desert growths, such as burro  
brush, but almost no cactus.

An oiled highway bears S.  $33\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} E.$ , to Oasis, from Nevada State  
Highway No. 3A, at the state line, through secs. 26 and 35. The  
Nevada portion of the highway is on a long tangent bearing  
N.  $39^{\circ} 23' W.$  4 other unimproved rut roads bear southwesterly  
from the highway toward the range of mountains to the west.

There is no evidence of any mineral activity in the township.  
About 100 acres of land has been cleared and fenced in secs.  
35 and 36, but there is no evidence of any cultivation of  
the land at the time this resurvey was executed. The cleared  
land is very loose sand. There is no other improvements in the  
township.

RETRACEMENT OF A PORTION OF THE S. BDY. OF T. 3 S., R. 35 E.

Survey executed by G. W. Baker, Deputy Surveyor, in 1884.

The cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, Tps. 3 and 4 S., R. 35 E.,  
is evidenced by the stub of the old post buried in ground in  
center of a mound of stone, 5 ft. base and 2 ft. high.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground,  
with brass cap marked
