

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE REESE RIVER GUIDE MERIDIAN,
E. BDY. OF T. 7 N., R. 42 E.

Chains

Dependent resurvey of the Reese River Guide Meridian, E. Bdy, T. 7 N. R. 42 E., reestablishing the survey executed by C. C. Tracy, Deputy Surveyor, in 1867.

Beginning at the original cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 N., Rs. 42 and 43 E., which is a juniper stake, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., greatly decayed, and the marks nearly obliterated, loosely set in a mound of stone.

At point for cor.,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with the original stake deposited at the base, for cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 N., Rs. 42 and 43 E., with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound
of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

Thence

N. 0°16' E., along E. bdy. of sec. 36, (S½ mile)

Over rolling land, through dense short undergrowth; asc. gradually 40 ft. along W. slope to ¼ sec. cor.

17.30 Dry wash, 20 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S.80°W.; asc.

40.15 Intersect the original ¼ sec. cor., which is a decayed stake with marks almost obliterated, loosely set in a small mound of stone.

At point for cor.,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with the remains of the original stake deposited at the base, for ¼ sec. cor. for sec. 36, T. 7 N., R. 42 E. only, with brass cap mkd.

Thence

N. 0°32' E., along E. bdy. of sec. 36. (N½ mile)

Asc. gradually 25 ft. over W. slope.

28.60 Dry wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S.85°W. from S.70°E.; asc. gradually 20 ft.

40.20 Intersect the original cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is the remains of a decayed juniper stake, with marks nearly obliterated and lying on top of a small mound of stone.

At point for cor.,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 28 ins. in the ground, with the remains of the original cor. deposited at the base, for cor. of secs. 25 and 36, T. 7 N., R. 42 E. only, with brass cap mkd.
