Chains

From this closing sec. cor., the cor. of secs. 31 and 32 on the S. bdy. of T. 8 N., R. 43 E., bears N. $84^{\circ}57'$ E., 5.73 chs. dist.

Land, rolling mountainous.

Soil, sandy, gravelly and rocky; 4th rate.

Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, shadscale, greasewood and a fair growth of grass.

At midpoint on the N. bdy. of sec. 5,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 5 only, with brass cap mkd.

At a point on the N. bdy. of sec. 6, 40.00 chs. in departure from the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6,

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with a quart of broken glass deposited at the base and in a large mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. for sec. 6 only, with brass cap mkd.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

A great variety of land and soil is found in Township 7 North, Range 43 East. The general elevation of the township is 6,000 ft. to 8,000 ft. The eastern part of the township is a series of granite crags and cliffs covered with juniper and nut pine trees, most of which do not exceed 12 inches in diameter. The grazing in this section of the township is fair. The rest of the township consists of rolling high mountains. The middle and northwest parts of the township are covered with a dense growth of juniper and nut pine. The southwest part of the township extends from the mountainous region into Smoky Valley. There are no trees on this portion of the township, but it is covered with dense low undergrowth. This undergrowth consists of shadscale, stunted sage, bunchgrass, greasewood and native shrubs and grasses.

There are three main springs in the township, - Baxter's Springs in the northeast part of section 25, Willow Springs in the northwest part of section 17, and Timber Ridge Springs in the northwest part of section 32.
