

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the South Boundary,

T.9 N., R.43 E., M.D.M.

Chains

Bury the old stone alongside the iron post, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, rolling mountains.
Soil, sandy to rocky, 4th. rate.
Timber, a few scattered juniper in the extreme east part.
Undergrowth, sage, shadscale and grasses.

Retracement of a Portion of the South Boundary,
T.9 N., R.43 E.

N.89°35'W., bet. secs. 3 and 34.

40.00 Point for 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 3 and 34; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

40.09 Proportionate point for 1/4 sec. cor.; not monumented.

80.18 The cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33, and 34, marked by a partly decayed pine stake, 40 ins. long, 2 ins. square, with illegible scribings, lying in the base of a small mound of stone.

N.88°48'W., bet. secs. 4 and 33. (East 1/2 mile).

40.06 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 4 and 33, marked by the original monument, a granite stone, 14x11x10 ins., above ground, firmly set, mkd. 1/4 on N. face, and witnessed as described in the official record.

N.89°23'W., bet. secs. 4 and 33. (West 1/2 mile).

40.16 The original cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32 and 33, marked by a granite stone, 13x12x10 ins., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.

Survey of the West Boundary of T.8 N., R.44 E.

From the cor. of Ts.7 & 8 N., R.44 E., described in the resurvey of the N. bdy. of T.7 N., R.44 E., concurrently executed under Group 252-N., an iron post, 3 ins. diam., protruding 9 ins. above surface, with brass cap properly marked and dated 1939.

North, on the W. bdy. of sec. 31.

Over mountainous land, through scattered timber and dense undergrowth. Desc. 160 ft. over W. slope.

5.37 The cor. of Ts.7 & 8 N., R.43 E., marked by an iron post, 3 ins. diam., 9 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described in the survey of the S. bdy. of T.8 N., R.43 E., concurrently surveyed under this group.
