

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of the North Bdy. of T. 12 N., R. 56 E.

Chains

Over rolling land, through dense undergrowth; desc. gradually along a general S. slope.

2.00 Wash, 7 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S. 5° W.

4.10 Bull Creek, with channel 20 lks. wide, 4 ft. deep, through which a small seasonal stream flows S. 10° W. Thence over nearly level creek bottom land.

11.70 Graded gravel surfaced road, leading from Hamilton to Duckwater, Nevada, bears N. 5° W. and S. 5° E. Leave bottom land, bears N. and S.; enter rolling mountainous land; asc. 20 ft. over a rocky E. slope.

18.40 Wash, course SE.; asc. 5 ft.

29.30 Wash, course S. 50° E.; asc. 20 ft.

40.00 The original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, which is monumented with a trachyte stone, 6x10x12 ins., firmly set in a mound of stone, mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Deposit the old corner stone at base of the iron post and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

Land, rolling mountainous.

Soil, light fine sandy clay loam, alkaline in the E. 10 chains; the remainder is sandy clay, gravel and rock.

Timber, none; undergrowth, sagebrush, greasewood, shadscale and a good growth of grass.

General Description

The area covered by the limited resurveys made in this township lies along the valley of Bull Creek, which drains to the south. This is an intermittent stream which carries considerable runoff water in the spring and dries up in the late summer.

The improved county road, leading from Hamilton to Duckwater, Nevada, crosses section 1 in the north-south direction.

The area lies at an elevation somewhat below the 6,000 ft. elevation and is chiefly valuable for seasonal grazing purposes and it is fully utilized for this purpose.
