## General Description.

The area embraced within these Tp. bdys. is located near the NE. cor. of Lincoln County, Nevada along the Utah State boundary, approximately 50 miles S. of Baker, Nevada, in an area known as Hamlin Valley. Hamlin Wash, runs through the area in a northerly direction, carrying a considerable flow of water at times of flood and during the spring run off but usually dry at other times. "bench" land to the E. and W. of the wash is generally a gravelly clay soil, supporting a good growth of desert plants, white sage predominating, and furnish extensive winter range for cattle and sheep. There is a strip of land along Hamlin Wash, about a half to a mile wide, with a very deep clay loam soil of a fairly good quality.

There are no settlers within this area and practically no improvements. There are no improved roads within the area. Except for a strip of about a mile in width along the Utah boundary, there

is little or no timber.
