General Description

The area within fractional T. $9\frac{1}{2}$ N., R. 70 E., is located near the extreme northeast corner of Lincoln County, Nevada, approximately 30 miles south of Baker, Nevada, near the northern end of an area known as Hamlin Valley and at the head of the drainage area known as Big Springs Creek.

The area is rolling in character, with a soil of a gravelly clay texture which supports an extensive growth of various desert plants which afford fairly good winter range for livestock. Hamlin Wash passes through the eastern extremity of the area in a northerly direction and the soil of the strip, approximately a mile wide along the wash, is a deep clay loam of a fairly good character. There is one spring located near the center of the S. half of sec. 34, from which a small stream of water was flowing at the time of the survey.

There are no settlers, improvements or improved roads within the township and practically no timber.
