## General Description

Township 15 North, Range 70 East is situated northeast, about 12 miles distant from Baker, White Pine County, Nevada. It is entered from the south by the Ely-Delta improved road, and from the south and east by unimproved roads. The elevation above sea level of the southeast corner of the township as determined by a direct tie to U. S. Coast and Geodetic Survey bench mark X 74 is 5075 ft.

The land varies from rolling to rough mountainous, with the general slope southeastward. The soil is a gravelly clay, 3d rate in the southern quarter of the township, and becomes rocky, 4th rate, untillable in the two most northerly tiers of sections. There is no commercially valuable timber; no timber is in the southern three quarters of the township and but scattering in the north one quarter. The undergrowth consists of greasewood, with a scattering of sagebrush, and a sparse growth of native grass. Grazing varies from poor to fair.

Only about one third of the township is suitable for agriculture.

There are no settlers.
