

Dependent Resurvey of the North Boundary of T. 7 N., R. 60 E.

Chains

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to bedrock, and in a mound of stone, $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. base, to top, with brass cap mkd.

from which

A juniper, 8 ins. diam., bears S. $13\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 90 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 BT.

Reset the old marked limestone alongside and S. of the iron post.

This corner is set on a N. slope, 1.50 chs. S. of a small side ravine, course N. 60° E.

N. $89^{\circ} 45'$ W., along the N. bdy. of sec. 6, beginning new measurement.

Ascend slightly.

- 6.50 Divide, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.; desc. 130 ft. over rolling SW. slope.
- 20.30 Wash, in small side valley, course S. 20° E. for 4 chs., thence SE.
- 27.00 Low side spur, slopes S. 15° E.
- 30.50 Enter side valley, drains S. 10° E.
- 34.00 Leave side valley, asc. 100 ft. over rocky SE. slope.
- 40.41 The cor. of Ts. 7 and 8 N., Rs. 59 and 60 E.
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, gravelly and rocky.
Timber, scattered juniper; undergrowth, sagebrush.

Retracement of the East Boundary of T. 7 N., R. 60 E.
Surveyed by E. B. Monroe in 1871.

Note: At several points along this line, broken pieces of the original corner posts were found lying loose on the ground, but no evidence of the original locations of the posts could be found.

These field notes of this retracement are included here as an aid to any future resurvey which may be made of this line, and to provide a closure of the boundaries of T. 7 N., R. 60 E.

From the cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E.

N. $0^{\circ} 01'$ W., bet. secs. 31 and 36.

- 40.12 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Corner not monumented.
- 80.24 Point for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner position. However, scattered fragments of a wooden post, with marks "S" and "X" legible on one piece were found lying loose on the ground at a point 0.12 chs. N. and 0.01 chs. E. of the proportionate point for corner. Corner not monumented.
