

Dependent Resurvey, East Boundary, T. 14 N., R. 59 E.

Chains

Spur, slopes NW.; desc. 45 ft. over N. slope.

The original cor. of Ts. 14 and 15 N., R. 59 E., monumented with a conglomerate stone, 14x9x8 ins., set in a small mound of stone, mkd. with 6 grooves on the N., S., E. and W. faces.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A pinon, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 81° W., 61 lks. dist., mkd. T15N R59E S36 BT.

A pinon, 5 ins. diam., bears S. $62\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W., 35 lks. dist., mkd. T14N R59E S1 BT.

A boxed-in spring known as "Mud Springs", bears S. 45° W., 20.40 chs. dist.

The closing cor. of Ts. 14 and 15 N., R. 60 E., hereinafter described, bears North, 19.15 chs. dist.

Raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. base, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of corner.

Land, rolling mountainous.

Soil, sandy and gravelly to rocky.

Timber, scattering juniper and pinon; undergrowth, black brush, sagebrush and rabbit brush.

Note: Diligent search for evidence of the original survey of the N. bdy. of T. 14 N., R. 60 E. failed to reveal any original corners along this line.

From the cor. of Ts. 14 and 15 N., Rs. 60 and 61 E., described in the field notes of the W. bdy. of T. 14 N., R. 61 E.

West, between secs. 1 and 36.

Over rolling land, through timber and low undergrowth; asc. 55 ft. along a general N. slope to the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

Wash, 6 lks. wide, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. deep, drains N. 30° E.

7.30

Low flat spur, slopes N. 20° E.
