

## Independent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 15 N., R. 60 E.

## Chains

A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears S.  $11\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E., 280 lks. dist., mkd. T15N R61E S6 CC BT.

The standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor. on the S. bdy. of sec. 36, monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the Ind. Res. of the S. Bdy. of T. 16 N., R. 60 E. surveyed concurrently under Group 278, Nevada, bears N.  $89^{\circ} 51'$  E., 2.38 chs. dist.

The standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36, monumented with an iron post,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ins. diam., set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the field notes of the Ind. Res. of the S. Bdy. of T. 16 N., R. 60 E., bears S.  $89^{\circ} 51'$  W., 37.62 chs. dist.

Dig a circular trench, 5 ft. diam., 1 ft. deep, and raise a flat mound of earth around the iron post.

Land, rolling.

Soil, sandy and gravelly clay.

Timber, scattering juniper; undergrowth, low sagebrush.

## General Description

This township is situated 15-25 miles to the southwest of Ely, Nevada, in the south end of Jake's Valley and along the east foot of the White Pine Mountain section of the Nevada National Forest.

Numerous drainage channels head into the township from the hills and mountains in the adjoining townships to the south and west. Most of these fan out and disappear as they enter the nearly level floor of Jake's Valley which covers most of the township.

The soil on the hills and mountainsides along or near the south and west boundaries is generally sandy to gravelly and rocky in character, but the soil over the major portion of the township is a fine light colored alkaline clay.

Undergrowth on the slopes generally consists of sagebrush, black brush and rabbit brush and the valley floor also carries greasewood and shadscale. Juniper and pinon timber is found on the hills and mountains along the south and west boundaries of the township, but the major portion of the township is devoid of timber.

The area is chiefly valuable for stock grazing and a number of unimproved roads crisscross the township leading to stock water developments and campsites.
