No timber; undergrowth, low sagebrush and rabbit brush.

General Description

The portion of this township included in the present survey lies in the heart of Jake's Valley and is situated 25 to 30 miles northwest of Ely, Nevada. Paved U. S. Highway No. 50 crosses the north and northwest portions of the township, running in a northeast and southwest direction.

The soil over this portion of the township is composed of a light colored, fine textured alkaline clay.

Most of the area is devoid of timber. Undergrowth consists mostly of low sage, shadscale, salt weeds and grasses, with some black brush and greasewood.

A graded and lightly gravelled road crosses the area in a north and south direction. Numerous dirt roads branch off from this main road and lead to various stock watering developments and stockmen's campsites. The area is chiefly valuable for stock grazing purposes.
