GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The land covered by the survey consists of a high rolling mountain top, at an elevation of approximately 6000 ft. above sea level. The country is covered by a scattered to medium dense growth of pinon and juniper, with a few scattered pine in the higher elevations. The undergrowth is largely sagebrush, with lesser amounts of bitter brush, shadscale, weeds and grass. There are many unimproved roads used by herdsmen throughout the township. The only water found is at Summitt Springs in sec. 4, and wells in secs. 10 and 21. The land is chiefly valuable for grazing.
