Deflections from this meridian indicate that all lines have been carried forward acceptably.

## General Description.

Township 23 north, range 69 east, is situated southwesterly about 15 miles from Ibapah, Utah, and about 9 miles westerly from the headquarters of the Goshute Indian Reservation. Improved roads within the township connect Tippet and Uvada, Nevada, Ibapah, Utah and the Goshute Indian Reservation headquarters.

The character of the land within this township is mountainous and rolling mountainous in the south two tiers of sections, decreasing in precipitousness northward, becoming rolling.

The soil is a rocky, sandy light adobe, very shallow, upon a decomposed limestone subsoil. The drainage is generally northerly or northwesterly.

A dense growth of non-merchantable pinon pine, juniper, and mahogany is found within the south two tiers; this becomes scattering northward; there is little or no timber within the north three tiers. A dense undergrowth of sagebrush, shadscale, rabbitbrush, white sage and cheat grass covers the township.

There are no settlers within the township. The north half of the township, in addition to the east half of sections 24, 25, and 36 lies within the Goshute Indian Reservation.

The township affords good grazing for sheep, and to which it is fully allotted.

There are three springs of pure water, one each in sections 36, 35 and 25.
