

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

Township 24 north, range 69 east, is situated about 10 miles southwesterly from Ibapah, Utah, and about 9 miles westerly from the headquarters of the Goshute Indian Reservation. Improved roads within the township connect Tippett and Uvada, Nevada, Ibapah, Utah, and the Goshute Indian Reservation headquarters. This township lies wholly within the addition in Nevada to the Goshute Indian Reservation.

The soil is a gravelly clay and adobe upon a limestone subsoil, 3d rate.

With the exception of a few widely scattering juniper, there is no timber; undergrowth consists of shadscale, rabbitbrush, white sage, bunch grass and sand grass together with a scattering of sagebrush.

There are no settlers.

The township affords good grazing for sheep.
