

SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T. 6 S., R. 69 E.

Chains

West, bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Along N. slope.

4.00 Descend 120 ft.

10.00 Wooded gully, course irregularly N.; ascend 200 ft.

17.00 Spur, projects NE.; descend 110 ft.

26.50 Wooded gully, course NW.; ascend 25 ft.

33.00 Descend 240 ft. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.40.00 Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 3 ins. in the ground and in a mound of stone to top, with brass cap mkd.

A juniper, 10 ins. diam., bears N. $48\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 15 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S31 BT.A juniper, 20 ins. diam., bears S. $32\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ E., 7 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6 BT.

Descend 100 ft.

46.30 Head of draw, drains S.

48.00 Gully course S.; ascend 50 ft.

53.50 Spur, projects S. 65° W., a saddle bears NE. approximately 2 chs. dist.; continue to ascend 110 ft.

65.30 Same spur, projects NW.; descend 300 ft.

77.00 Gully, course S.; ascend 30 ft.

79.16 Point for the cor. of Ts. 6 and 7 S., Rs. 68 and 69 E.

Set an iron post, 30 ins. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
