A juniper, 6 ins. diam., bears N.72°W., 18 lks. dist.,

The closing corner is 19.20 chs. West of a B.L.M. fence, bears
S.6°E. and N.9 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W. and 12.00 and 22.80 chs. West of washes
draining to the N. and NE.

Land, rolling.
Soil, gravelly and rocky.
Timber, juniper, pine and pinon.

General Description

The land over this township is generally rolling or broken,
with the main drainage to the north and northwest. The soil over
the township is mostly shallow with sand, gravel and rock
predominating.

Undergrowth consists of black brush, sage, cacti and oak, with
considerable juniper and pinon timber found scattered over the
township, especially on the north slopes.

Water is scarce, especially in the summer months, so that the
area is best suited to winter stock grazing.

There are no developed mineral deposits and no patented mining
claims in the township. An unimproved road, which is little more
than a trail, makes a loop through the township from near the
middle of the west boundary to near the middle of the north boundary.
