A juniper, 7 ins. diam., bears N.77 $\frac{1}{2}$ °E., 35 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S31 BT.

A juniper, 5 ins. diam., bears S.75 $\frac{1}{4}$ °W., 40 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S6 BT.

Continue descent 110 ft. through scattered timber.

- 44.70 Ravine, course S.30°W., heads to NE., about 5 chs. dist. Ascend 340 ft. over SE. slope.
- 61.00 Prominent boulder, 30 x 20 x 15 ft., on line, on apex of spur, from N.75°W., bearing to N.60°E. Descend 155 feet over SW. slope.
- 69.80 Ravine, course SE., from N.75°W. Ascend 140 ft. over NE. slope.
- 79.72 The cor. of Ts. 7 and 8 S., Rs. 68 and 69 E., described in the field notes of the survey of the E. bdy. of T. 8 S., R. 68 E. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky. Timber, juniper and pinon, very scattered pine; undergrowth, blackbrush, oak, cacti and sage.

General Description

The character of the land included in this township varies from nearly level desert to rolling and broken mountainous.

The soil over the entire township is generally quite shallow, poor and rocky. The area is totally unsuitable for agriculture and is poor grazing land.

Although cut by numerous channels and washes there are no living streams in the area, although a few weak seep springs are found in northern higher portions of the township. The general direction of drainage is to the south.

The predominating vegetation is scattered desert grasses with undergrowth of sagebrush, black brush, rabbit brush, cacti, and some oak and manzanita on the higher hills. Scattering stands of juniper and pinon timber are also found on the higher ridges, especially on the north slopes.

There are no patented mineral claims within the township and no mining activity at the present time, though old prospect holes here and there give evidence of past mining and prospecting activities of a limited nature.
