Chains

- A pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N.27°E., 18 lks. dist., mkd. T6S R70E S31 BT.
- A pine, 10 ins. diam., bears S.40½°E., 110 lks. dist., mkd. T7S R70E S6 BT.
- A pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S.75°W., 18 lks. dist., mkd. T7S R69E S1 BT.
- A pine, 36 ins. diam., bears N.61°W., 125 lks. dist., mkd. T6S R69E S36 BT.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky.
Timber, juniper, pinon and pine; undergrowth, oak, manzanita, sage and cacti.

General Description

The land over this township is mostly rolling or broken desert valleys and hills, with drainage generally to the south and southeast.

The soil is mostly a light colored silt, sand, gravel and rock.

A variety of undergrowth is found over the area, such as desert grasses, black brush, sage, cacti and oak. There is considerable juniper and pinon timber to be found scattered over the township, usually mostly on north slopes. Water, sufficient for stock watering purposes, is to be found at various places over the township, making the land available for grazing purposes.

Here and there over the township one finds small prospect holes, but no valuable mineral deposits have as yet been discovered.
