## General Description

The land over this township varies from nearly level desert to rolling and broken hills, cut by numerous washes, draining generally to the south and southeast. The soil is mostly a light colored fine silt, sand and gravel with considerable rock over most of the area.

A variety of undergrowth is found over the area, such as desert grasses, black brush, oak, sage, cacti and occasionally, mesquite. There are many rather thin stands of juniper and pinon over the township, and an occasional Joshua tree.

There is an occasional small prospect hole here and there over the township, but no valuable mineral deposits have been found and there are no patented mining claims within the township.

The land over most of the township is suitable for winter stock grazing.

An unimproved road crosses the township, running in a general north and south direction.
