General Description

The land over this township is mostly rolling or broken. A high ridge runs in a north and south direction through the center of the township from section 5 to section 32. This ridge causes drainage to leave the township in every cardinal direction: S., W., N., and E.

The soil over the township is mostly shallow, with sand, gravel and rock predominating.

A variety of undergrowth is found over the area, such as desert grasses, black brush, sage, cacti and oak. There is considerable juniper and pinon timber to be found, scattered over the township, especially along the central north-south ridge described above.

Water is scarce, but is sufficient in winter for stock watering purposes.

There are no developed mineral deposits in the township. An unimproved road crosses the northeast part of the township, running in a NW.-SE. direction.
