General Description

The foregoing lines, forming a part of the boundaries of the Charles Sheldon Antelope Range are situated easterly, about 18 miles distant from Camp Sheldon, Humboldt County, Nevada. The land varies from nearly level to rolling; with seasonal watercourses draining east; without timber; and with a 3rd rate sandy, alkaline clay soil, covered with a scattering undergrowth of sagebrush, shadscale and greasewood. There are no settlers.
