

Subdivision of portion of T. 47 N., R. 28 E.

Chains

raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor.

From point of intersection; mile post No. 242, Oregon-Nevada State Boundary, bears S. 89° 38' E., 32.23 chs. dist.; and is monumented with a trap boulder, 56x14x6 ins. above ground, mkd. 42 L on the N. and 242 on the S. faces; surrounded by a trench, 6 ft. diam.; with a mound of stone to N. At point for mile post No. 242

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, with the original cor. monument alongside, with brass cap mkd.

And from same point, mile post No. 243, Oregon-Nevada State Boundary, bears N. 89° 38' W., 48.84 chs. dist.; which is monumented with a basalt stone, 24x10x3 ins. above ground, mkd. 42 L on the N. and 243 on S. faces. At point for mile post No. 243

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 30 ins. in the ground, with the original cor. monument deposited at base, with brass cap mkd.

raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, N. of cor.

And from same point the closing cor. of T. 41 S., Rs. 33 and 34 E., Oregon, bears S. 86° 30' W., 12.47 chs. dist.; which is monumented with a granite stone, 13x10x8 ins. above ground, mkd. C C on N. face and 6 notches on the E. and W. edges; and a mound of stone to the N. (This closing cor. is situated 0.84 chs. South of the true state line.)

Land, rolling.
Soil, sandy, rocky clay, 3rd rate.
No timber; undergrowth, sagebrush.
Grazing, poor.

General Description

The 4th meridional line of T. 47 N., R. 28 E., forming a part of the extreme E. bdy. of the Charles Sheldon Antelope Range is situated easterly about 12 miles distant from Camp Sheldon, Nevada. The land is rolling, with a westerly drainage; without timber; and with 3rd rate sandy clay soil, covered with a scattering undergrowth of sagebrush. There are no settlers. The land adjacent to this line is suitable for grazing.
