Chains 40.24	<p>Intersect the original <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., which is a trapstone, 7x9x20 ins., mkd. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> on W. face, firmly set.</p> <p>At point for cor.,</p> <p>Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, with the original corner stone deposited at the base, for <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.</p> <div><math display="block">\begin{array}{c} \frac{1}{4} \\ S\ 1 \mid S\ 6 \\ 1941 \end{array}</math></div> <p>raise a mound of stone, 4 ft. diam., 1 ft. high, around corner post.</p> <p>Thence</p> <p>N. 0°57' W., bet. secs. 1 and 6, (north half mile.)</p> <p>Over rolling land,</p> <p>8.90 Gully, drains NE. 1 ch., thence N.</p> <p>23.70 Recross gully, drains NW.</p> <p>30.00 Leave rolling land end enter nearly level plain, bears NE. and SW.; continue through very dense yellow top undergrowth.</p> <p>The reestablished closing cor. of secs. 1 and 6 falls in center of east-west road where the corner monument may be disturbed.
