

Dependent Resurvey of the North Boundary, T. 13 N., R. 21 E.

Chains	Soil, shallow sand and clay, stony with granite ledges; 3rd rate. Timber, medium 2nd growth pinon and juniper. Undergrowth, sagebrush, bitter brush and a fair growth of native grasses and weeds.
	N. 88° 57' E., bet secs. 1 and 36.
	Over broken mountainous land, through medium dense mixed timber and dense undergrowth; descend 10 ft.
1.00	Wash, course S., ascend 45 ft.
11.60	Low point of spur, slopes S.; descend 10 ft.
14.60	Channel of wash in ravine, 40 lks. wide, course S. 60° W., ascend 100 ft. along a broken NW. slope.
21.00	Gulch, course NW. ascend 215 ft. along a NW. slope, covered with dense timber.
34.00	Top of side spur, slopes N.; descend 40 ft. along a broken SW. slope.
37.90	Head of gulch, course N. 20° W.; ascend 20 ft.
39.75	Head of gulch, course NW.; ascend 14 ft.
40.48	Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 36, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. Set an iron post, 36 ins. long, 1 in. diam.; 28 ins. in the ground with a circular collar of stone around post, with brass cap mkd. <div style="text-align: center;"> S 36 $\frac{1}{4}$ ——— S 1 1950 </div>
	from which A pinon pine, 6 ins. diam. bears N. 92° W., 79 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S36 BT. A pinon pine, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 43 $\frac{3}{4}$ ° E., 30 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S1 BT. Ascend 105 ft. along a S. slope.
46.00	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., which forms a saddle; from which a head of ravine, forms toward a course S. 60° E.; descend 80 ft. along a SE. slope.
54.60	A flat spur projects SE.; descend 105 ft. along an E. slope.
61.30	Gulch, course SE.; descend 38 ft. along on E. slope
65.70	Point of spur projects SE.; descend 45 ft. along on E. slope.
67.65	Main channel of wash 15 lks. wide in ravine, course S.; ascend 96 ft.
71.20	Sharp spur projects S. 30° W.; descend 60 ft.
74.25	Channel of ravine 8 lks. wide, course S. 30° W.; ascend 176 ft. along a broken series of drains on a S. slope.
80.96	The cor. of Ts. 13 and 14 N., Rs. 21 and 22 E., marked by the
