General Description

T. 34 N., R. 62 E., is situated about 18 miles S. of Wells, Nevada. The paved highway from Wells to Ely, Nevada passes through the township. The land is a nearly level valley, draining into a very shallow lake without outlet, known as Snow Water Lake, situated in the extreme southern and southeastern part of the township, and which varies in size with the seasons and from year to year. The extreme western portion of the township is a very gradual east slope, the northern end being included in ranches of the area known as Clover Valley.

The central and northern portions would probably be fairly well suited for agricultural land if sufficient water for irrigation were available. The eastern portion of the area is a poor grade of clay soil with much alkali.

The entire township, outside the northwestern portion which is a part of the ranches, is used as winter stock range.

There is no timber within the township.

There are no habitations within the township; the houses of the ranches in the northwest portion being situated in the adjacent townships to the west.
