

DEPENDENT RESURVEY OF THE SOUTH BOUNDARY OF T. 18 N., R. 19 E.

Chains

A balsam fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.29°W., 63 lks. dist.,
mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S5 BT

- 45.00 Low spur, slopes N., desc. 210 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 61.10 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, 2 ins. deep, course N., asc. 100 ft.
- 64.80 Spur, slopes N. 10 chs.
- 70.00 Spur, slopes N. 10 chs., desc. 250 ft. over steep NW. slope.
- 79.82 The original cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32 which is a surfaced pine stake, 3 ins. square, 24 ins. long, with distinct scribe marks on all faces, loosely set in a large embedded mound of stone.
- At point for cor., in center of mound,
- Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 26 ins. in the ground, with the original stake deposited at the base, for cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd.

- A balsam fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.58°E., 5 lks. dist.,
mkd. T17N R19E S5 BT
- A yellow pine, 16 ins. diam., bears S.29 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W., 105 lks. dist.,
mkd. T17N R19E S6 BT
- A yellow pine, 10 ins. diam., bears N.53°W., 62 lks. dist.,
mkd. T18N R19E S31 BT
- Land, mountainous.
Soil, shallow, coarse, rocky clay loam, 3rd rate.
Timber, yellow pine, balsam fir, mahogany.
Undergrowth, sagebrush, manzanita, laurel, buck brush.
Grazing, very good.
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- N. 89°41' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31,
- Over rough mountainous land thru heavy timber and medium dense undergrowth. Desc. 40 ft. over steep N. slope.
- 5.50 Whites Canyon Creek, 10 lks. wide, 18 ins. deep, course N.60°E., continue over narrow creek bottom, thru masses of wash boulders.
- 10.50 Old creek channel, course N.70°E., leave bottom land and asc. abrupt, rocky SE. slope thru very heavy mahogany timber, 340 ft.
- 28.50 Rocky point; slope change to steep S. slope.
- 36.00 Slope changes to steep rocky SE., asc. 70 ft.
- 39.46 Proportionate distance; no trace was found of the original $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 26 ins. in the ground,
