Chains

deposit glass
at base of post; also raise a mound of stone, 2½ ft. base,
1½ ft. high, on the shoulder of road at a point 27 lks. N. of
cor.

65.80 Begin gradual ascent over E. slope.

79.70 The original stan. cor. of Tps. 20 S., Rs. 61 and 62 E.; a decayed
wooden post with cooper bolt in top, buried 1½ ft. beneath surface
of road; no evidence of original bearing tree.

At cor. point, in center of gravelled road, bears E. and W.

Set an iron post, 3-ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 54 ins. in the ground,
for stan. cor. of Tps. 20 S., Rs. 61 and 62 E., with brass cap mkd.

Along center of gravelled Charleston Road, bearing E. and W.,
through the subdivision of Meadow Acres.

32.80 Intersection of a street from the S., with an E. and W. road.

33.00 Telephone line, extends S.

40.49 Proportionate point; no corner set.

42.50 Well and water tank, bears South, about 3.50 chs. dist.

43.50 Junction of road from the S. with an E. and W. road.

65.80 Junction of street from the N., with an E. and W. road.

71.05 Junction of street from the N., with an E. and W. road.
