

Dependent Resurvey of the East Boundary of T. 22 S., R. 61 E.

Chains

A monument on cone-shaped peak bears N. 35° 34' E., approximately 8 miles dist. in T. 20 S., R. 62 E.

This cor. is 50 lks. (2 rods) E. and 50 lks. N. of the NE. cor. of fences bearing S. and W., and in line with center of lane extending southerly, also in lane bearing E. and W. Claimant to the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. 1, T. 22 S., R. 61 E., claims to have established the above fences in about the year 1910, when the original corner monument was in place. This point is accepted as a perpetuation of the original corner point.

Land, rolling on S. portion; level on N. portion.

Soil, rocky and gravelly on S. portion; sandy and clay on N. portion, 4th and 2d rates.

Timber, mesquite on N. portion.

Undergrowth, creosote.

Grazing, poor to fair.

Dependent Resurvey of the Subdivision of T. 22 S., R. 62 E.

Reestablishment of the Survey executed by T. A. Magee,
Deputy Surveyor, in 1881.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35, and 36, on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

N. 0° 27' E., bet. secs. 35 and 36.

Over mountainous land, through short undergrowth; gradually ascend over rolling general E. slope.

- 6.70 Wash, drains SE.; ascend 100 ft.
- 27.60 Wash, drains SE.
- 40.32 Proportionate point, 200 ft. above sec. cor. on S. bdy.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 12 ins. in the ground to rock, with a basalt stone 8x9x3 ins., mkd. with a cross (+) deposited at base, and supported in a mound of stone to top, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.



Ascend broken E. slope.

- 45.60 Spur, slopes SE.
- 52.40 Ravine, drains SE.; ascend SE. slope.
- 64.50 Ridge, 200 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., bears NE. and SW.; gradually descend along NW. and W. slopes.
- 73.60 Spur, slopes N. 20° W.; descend steep, rocky NE. slope, 225 ft. to cor.
- 80.64 Proportionate point.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 6 ins. in the ground to rock, with a basalt stone 10x4x2 ins.; mkd. with a cross (+) deposited at base, and supported in a mound of stone to top, for cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35, and 36, with brass cap mkd.
