

Retracements and Investigative Surveys, T. 32 N., R. 24 E.

Chains

Purpose

The object of this record of retracements and investigative surveys in T. 32 N., R. 24 E. is to preserve, in official form, the results of an examination made of the area in 1948. Supplemental Special Instructions for Group 338, Nevada, approved August 2, 1949, are essentially based on data contained in this presentation, but since it is now evident that the surveys and resurveys provided for in these supplemental special instructions will probably not be executed for many years, it becomes imperative that these data be preserved in the official record, awaiting the time when the needed surveys and resurveys can be executed.

No corners were established or reestablished in T. 32 N., R. 24 E. during the course of the retracement and investigative surveys.

History of Surveys

The east boundary of adjoining T. 32 N., R. 23 E. and the west two and one-half miles of the north boundary of T. 32 N., R. 24 E. were surveyed by G. W. Garside, Deputy Surveyor, in 1872. The east boundary of the township and sections 25 to 27 inclusive and sections 34 to 36 inclusive were surveyed by Hatch, Skinner, and Preble, Deputy Surveyors, in 1874. The east boundary of adjoining T. 32 N., R. 23 E. was resurveyed by Albert B. Rich, U. S. Surveyor, under Group 3, in 1910. The east boundary of the township, surveyed concurrently under the present Group 338 in 1948, was accepted February 28, 1950.

The work in T. 32 N., R. 24 E. consists of the retracement of the portion of the north boundary originally surveyed and an investigative tie across the remaining portion of this boundary; retracement of the south boundary, together with ties to all known subdivisional corners within the township.

For a description of instruments and equipment used and methods of survey see field notes of concurrent retracements made in T. 31 N., R. 24 E.; also see official field notes of the survey of the S., E., and W. bdys. of T. 31 N., R. 25 E. which was executed concurrently under this same Group.

The geographic position of the SE. cor. of T. 32 N., R. 24 E., as determined from the official Department of the Interior Cadastral map of Nevada, is latitude 40° 35' 15" N., and longitude 119° 12' 00" W.

Retracement of a Portion of the North Boundary of T. 32 N., R. 24 E.

Along the Line Originally Surveyed by
G. W. Garside, Deputy Surveyor, in 1872.

Beginning at the cor. of Ts. 32 and 33 N., Rs. 23 and 24 E., which is monumented with an iron post, 3 ins. diam., firmly set, mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record.
