Chains

Ascend slightly.

45.00 Wide bench, slopes W.; descend 90 ft. on NW. slope.

57.00 Wash, 40 lks. wide, course S. 75° W.; ascend 90 ft.

63.00 Top of bench, bears E. and W.; descend 20 ft. on broken NW. slope.

80.00 Point for the cor. of Ts. 32 and 33 N., Rs. 25 and 26 E.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground to bedrock, with brass cap mkd.

General Description

The E. bdy. of Ts. 31 and 32 N., R. 25 E. crosses the eastern portion of a typical arid desert valley located between the Selenite Range to the west and the Pahsupp Mountains to the east. The northern portion extends into the foothills of the Pahsupp Mountains.

There is no water in the immediate vicinity. There are no settlers, permanent improvements, or improved roads in the immediate vicinity.
